I am directed to invite your attention to the subject noted above and to inform that National Judicial Data Grid (NJDG) database is a mine of data which captures both closed as well ongoing matters at various stages of litigation. With a view to provide access to this storehouse of eCourt data, the eCommittee of the Supreme Court with the help of NIC has facilitated the creation of Open Application Programming Interfaces (APIs).

2 This open API facility has now been made available to institutional litigants within the Government, including semi-Governmental and local bodies including PSUs. This open facility will allow the State Government Departments to consume the available NJDG data thereby helping them in effectively tracking and managing their litigation in various courts. The APIs can be utilized by each user Department to make its own developments using the platform for tracking cases and managing pendency.

3. In this regard, a copy of DO Letter No. 12012/100/200-eCourts, dated 9.9.2020 received from the Secretary, Department of Justice, Ministry of Law & Justice, Government of India is enclosed herewith and you are requested to register on National API Exchange Platform and take advantage of the Open Application Programming Interfaces (APIs) access to develop a robust court case monitoring system based on the NJDG data. A set of simple guidelines explaining the facility and how to register for Open API access is also being enclosed for information.

As you are aware, the National Judicial Data Grid (NJDG) is an online repository of case statistics of the district and subordinate courts of the country and the High courts. The NJDG database is a mine of data which captures both closed cases and ongoing matters at various stages of litigation. Its efficacy as an innovative case management tool has also been acknowledged by the World Bank. With a view to provide access to this storehouse of eCourts data, the eCommittee of the Supreme Court with the help of NIC has facilitated the creation of Open Application Programming Interfaces (APIs).

This Open API facility has now been made available to institutional litigants within the Government, including semi-Governmental and local bodies including PSUs. This Open API facility will allow the State Government Departments to consume the available NJDG data thereby helping them in effectively tracking and managing their litigation in various courts. The APIs can be utilized by each user Department to make its own developments using the platform. The Open API for institutional litigants can help them keep track of cases centrally at an institutional level. Institutional litigants can now monitor the state of readiness in respect of their court cases and manage pendency. This will promote transparency, efficiency and compliance from the litigants' perspective.

Through this facility, the various departments of the State Government can generate a unique department ID and authentication key for using the NJDG data. Using the department ID and authentication key, each department can access the NJDG data using Open APIs. The institutional litigants to register themselves for Open API access will have to register themselves on the National API Exchange Platform (NAPIX) which is available on <https://bharatapi.gov.in>. A set of simple guidelines explaining the facility and how to register for Open API access is also being enclosed for information.

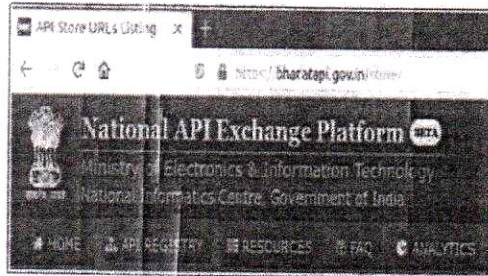

STEP 1: CREATE YOUR ACCOUNT

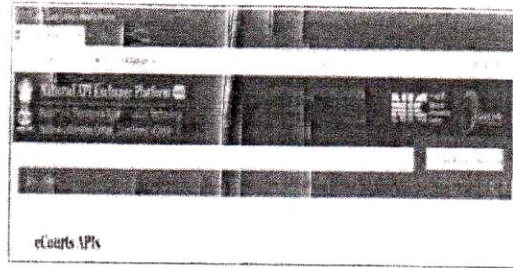
1. Go to this website
<https://bharatapi.gov.in/store>
2. From the Home page, click on API REGISTRY at the top navigation menu.



3. Click on the eCourts icon.



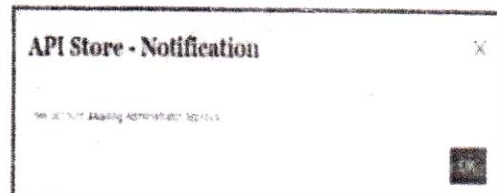
4. Click on "Sign up" at the top navigation menu to create subscriber user.



5. Fill the user subscription form.
Click sign up subscriber button.

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**STEP 2 - APPLICATION FORM FOR
E-COURTS OPEN API**

1. The subscriber needs to fill the application form.
2. Signature and seal of the officer have to be affixed.
3. The countersignature of the Central Project Coordinator (CPC) of the High Court should be obtained for authentication and approval. (e-mail IDs of CPC are available in the following link: https://ecourts.gov.in/ecourts_home/static/contactus.php)
4. The scanned copy of the application to be sent to the e-Committee, Supreme Court of India at ecommittee@ajil.gov.in
5. e-Committee will approve the subscriber and provide Department ID and Authentication Key to the subscriber.
6. Once Subscriber login is approved by e-Committee, the subscriber can log in to <https://bharatapi.gov.in> and sign in with the created credentials for the subscription of API.
