Subject:- The All India Services (PAR) Rules, 2007- annual medical check up for IAS officers.

Sir/Madam,

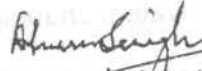
I am directed to invite attention to the subject mentioned above and to say that the Central Government has reviewed the current system for writing Annual Confidential Reports (ACRs) for officers belonging to All India Services. To improve the assessment of an officer's performance and capabilities and to determine the capacity building needs and suitability of an officer for particular areas of responsibility and assignments, the Central Government has finalized the All India Service (Performance Appraisal Report) Rules, 2007. The new system is to be implemented for the Indian Administrative Service Officers from the assessment year 2007-08. As per the PAR Rules, annual health check up is mandatory for all IAS officers above the age of 40 years.

2. The matter regarding the health check-up of IAS officers working with the affairs of the State has been examined and it has been decided by the Government that the IAS officers working at Chandigarh/Panchkula have the option to get their medical tests carried out either at the General Hospital, Sector-6, Panchkula or at the Haryana MLAs Hostel Dispensary, Chandigarh. The expenditure incurred by the General Hospital, Sector-6, Panchkula or the MLAs Hostel Dispensary Chandigarh on conducting the tests (through own/private labs) would be reimbursed to the Hospital/Dispensary by the Health Department, subsequently, in consultation with the Finance Department. The officers are not required to pay anything to the General Hospital, Sector-6, Panchkula or the MLAs Hostel Dispensary, Chandigarh in this regard.

3. The officers also have the option to get the requisite medical tests done at General Hospital, Sector-16, Chandigarh. For IAS officers working in the field, they can get the medical tests done at the nearest Government Hospital where such facilities exist. For such tests which are not available at the Government Hospitals, the actual expenditure incurred by the officers for getting these tests done through private hospitals/laboratories shall be reimbursable, as per actuals, subject to the condition that the overall expenditure on medical tests for the purpose of PAR, does not exceed Rs. 1500/-.

4. This issues with the concurrence of the Finance Department conveyed vide No. 1475-FCF, dated 4-4-2008.

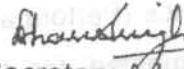

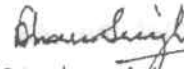
